





- 1) Stone sub-base use: Our plan utilizes the final hard surface area stone base to facilitate the construction of the building. Use of filter fabric below the stone base will limit the stone loss during construction.
- Parking: By phasing in the stone base, we can provide adequate parking for workers during construction. Limiting deliveries to set paths will reduce stone loss during the project.
 - Project trailer location: The project trailer location was set to provide the maximum oversight of the project while it is being constructed.
- 4) Utilize our existing relationships with local inspectors and our University Hospitals experience for project phasing requirements.
