Budget and Finance Manager Adrian Gorton explained the financials for today as including a Supplemental Appropriation for the Juvenile Detention Center other expenses account; Travel request increases for the Juvenile Court for Intercourt Conference; Travel requests for the Department of Emergency Services and Job and Family Services; a payment for Job and Family Services to Board of Mental Health for November and December 2019 Help Me Grow expenses in the amount of \$35,742.00; a payment for Maintenance to Hershberger Roofing and Siding for the re-roof of the Dog Warden Building in the amount of \$27,383.00; and a payment for the Sheriff's Office Law Enforcement Block Grant fund to Enforcement Video LLC for five Watchguard cameras in the amount of \$25,975.00.

There was a brief discussion about some emails and phone calls that they had received about the parking lot at the Dog Shelter. Commissioner Dvorak inquired about a punch list on the roof for the dog shelter and whether they need to wait on the payment.

The Board wanted to wait for an answer from Mr. Vernick on the roof so they waited to vote on the Financials.

COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE – 2020 IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS

Deputy Engineer Shane Hajjar presented the Board with a map of the county that indicates the proposed improvement projects for the year. Mr. Hajjar noted that it includes multiple sections of resurfacing and rehabilitation that include Auburn and Bell, Washington Street, the remainder of Caves Road, part of Aquilla Road, Taylor Wells, a couple of bridges, a new traffic signal at Haskins and Washington Street and before you today are a county wide guardrail and pavement markings programs that include Federal grant funding. Mr. Hajjar answered a question about the Federal grant funds, to which he explained that they applied through CEAO safety program and every four years there are funds available for guardrail and pavement markings. This year the guardrail program has 56 locations that are upgrading or replacing the spear head end type so they will be replaced with coil type ends. There was a brief discussion about areas that they eliminated guardrail, these locations are not feasible. This year the guardrail grant is for \$600,000.00 and the total estimated cost of the project is \$700,000.00. The pavement marking program is unique this year, the grant will allow them to add an epoxy paint to the striping that will have a longer lasting appearance in reflectivity, it is more expensive, in addition to that they will do the traditional striping along with some Township roads. Mr. Hajjar noted that of the \$375,000.00, \$150,000.00 is grant funds, \$180,000.00 local funding and \$45,000.00 is reimbursable to the county by the Townships.
