Members of the Geauga Farm Bureau present today included, Mandy Orahood, Ty Kellogg, Dale Baker, Bob Rogish, Kristen Sirna, Robert Swartz and Kirk Walker. Member Bob Rogish thanked the Commissioners and Elected Officials for their continued support of agriculture in Geauga County. Mr. Rogish mentioned bringing baskets of products for the Commissioners of items from the farms including local maple syrup and honey. Mr. Rogish briefly talked about membership in the farm bureau, being a small family farm to large commercial farms, but are always looking for more members. Mr. Rogish responded to a question from Commissioner Lennon about Mr. Patterson being Vice President of the State Farm Bureau and local president is Kevin Holy. Mr. Lennon mentioned the County comprehensive plan with a strong presence of small farms growing within the County. Mr. Dvorak inquired about having an FFA in Geauga, to which Mr. Rogish stated that he was in the FFA when he went to Auburn Career Center when they had the agriculture program. Mr. Rogish noted that they are keeping up on the regulations trying to be placed on agriculture.

Farm Bureau member Kristen Sirna explained that they are sustainable farm, not organic, noting that they use beneficial insects, not sprays. Ms. Sirna stated that there is really no difference in nonorganic and organic, but fresh and local is what everyone is looking for.

Mr. Rogish noted that the Farm Bureau broadcast the 4-H shows live during the fair last year, so, family that couldn't attend could watch. Farm Bureau member Mandy Orahood explained that only 2% of the population is involved in agriculture, and most people now haven't experienced farm life, along with not knowing where their food comes from so they spend a lot of time doing education. Mr. Rogish added that they do a lot of partnering with Soil and Water. While we aren't affected by the Lake Erie bill of rights in the western basin, we are keeping track of how many days we are spreading manure, keeping the database so we have evidence that we can't do the same due to snow pack and cold temperatures.
