#### NEWBURY AND WEST GEAUGA SCHOOL DISTRICT MERGER

Newbury School Board President Maggie Zock and School Board member Dave Lair along with West Geauga School Board President Dr. Bill Bears came before the Commissioners to talk about the merger of the school districts and the process they are working through regarding the current Newbury School land and buildings. Ms. Zock explained that effective June 30, 2020 the territory transfer will be final and so they are engaging a level of interest or resources regarding the land and buildings, having reached out to the Trustees and now the Commissioners on what will be the former Newbury School. Ms. Zock explained that the firm Bergess and Bergess are assisting them with the property and has offered to do breakout sessions with any entity that is interested in doing a positive change, the property is the heart of Newbury and in Geauga County. Commissioner Spidalieri thanked them for coming, adding that the Commissioners are in the process of looking to relocate our Senior Center and our Job and Family Services and that it would be worth the Board taking a look at the property. Mr. Spidalieri stated that they would talk to Mr. Swenson from Job and Family along with Ms. Boalt from the Department on Aging. Ms. Zock stated that whatever happens with the property needs to be positive for economic growth or development. There are 39 acres, with two buildings. Mr. Lair explained that one building was started to be built in 1928 and added on to numerous times and is about 96,000 square feet, the 2<sup>nd</sup> building where the auditorium and library are located is about 30,000 square foot and was built in 1972.

Commissioner Lennon inquired if there had been any ideas for the property when the merger talks were being started. Ms. Zock stated that the process of the merger has been lengthy and Newbury had a Board change for the better but the property has really been on the back burner, noting that West Geauga will make a final decision. Mr. Lennon expressed that the County is in a situation where they want to get out of old buildings that cost a lot of money to maintain, and not that the building couldn't be renovated, but it is still an old building. Mr. Lennon noted that depending on what happens in the future that they may have to look at other accommodations. Mr. Lennon stated that he would like to see something go on the property that helps Newbury and the County. Ms. Zock explained that on May 20th they are holding a zoom meeting with public participation. Mr. Lennon inquired if the library was still there, to which Mr. Lair explained that the library is there rent free as a benefit for the school as they ran the library as the school library, adding that he feels that they like being there and it is a benefit to the community. Ms. Zock stated they are approaching any public entity that may have interest they are engaging a level of interest, it may not be realistic for one to take on the burden but shared. Ms. Zock stated that per the ORC there are steps they have to go through, first right of refusal, then public auction or any other taxing entity. Dr. Bears stated that you cannot negotiate with the public, but government as a taxing entity they can negotiate. Dr. Bears noted that the property can be parceled, and it was noted that there are 7 parcels in total of the 39 acres. Dr. Bears added don't think this is an all or nothing. Ms. Zock stated that as individual Board members they get approached so they are excited to see the ideas that the public has for the property. Dr. Bears noted that the students from Newbury are being brought to the West Geauga school central location, so there is no need for the buildings for an educational purpose. Commissioner Dvorak stated that he had answered a question he had about the buildings, having lived in Newbury he contributed to those buildings, the Commissioners need to have a conversation about what their needs are. Dr. Bears added that he answered the question about the need for the building but wanted to make sure that this needs to be a positive outcome for both districts, the Township and the County, it needs to promote the district and the area, adding that it will not become an eye sore they don't want to have it happen, that they lived through

that. The Board thanked them for coming to the meeting and talking about the property.
