#### STATE SENATOR JERRY CIRINO – LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

State Senator Jerry Cirino explained that he has been in this new position for about six months now and while on Summer Break he was traveling around to meet with Commissioners and provide a briefing about what has been happening in Columbus. Mr. Cirino talked about the \$75 Billion-dollar Operating Budget that they had been working on and that they will start on the Capital Budget in the fall. Mr. Cirino added that the Governor didn't line item veto much. One of the things in the budget was to reform funding for K-12 schools that allows for growth and support for charter schools, adding that he was not against public schools. Mr. Cirino explained that this is the State support of the student and on average is around \$6,000.00 / year. Mr. Cirino co-sponsored a bill that was put into the Budget to become law that will require Judges to have political affiliation on ballots. The election law that was amended was over 100 years old.

Mr. Cirino briefly discussed the higher education bill that included improved guidance counseling, a second chance program that will allow kids that drop out of college after two years as a way to get students back to school and some free speech issues. This second chance program is a pilot program that is a one-time opportunity.

In the Budget included the largest state income tax reduction, reducing brackets and tax liability. There was a lot of things to support and keep Medicaid healthy but to also not be taken advantage of. Expressing his frustration on the unemployment fraud, with almost a billion dollars in false payouts. People that needed money didn't get it, and it was a waste of tax dollars. Mr. Cirino stated that they are also looking at critical race theory, and what he sees as indoctrination and rewriting of American history, he gets upset by that. The training materials he has seen are just appalling, and he doesn't want his grandchildren to feel guilty for something that happened in history.

There was a brief discussion about vaccinations and forcing an employee to obtain one in order to work is very problematic. Mr. Cirino expressed that he is enjoying being a Senator.

Commissioner Spidalieri expressed that the local government funds continue to shrink and that counties operate on Sales Tax and of the 6.76% that is collected only 1% comes to the County and the rest go to the state. When does the state finally give additional funding to the County to operate programs that are being funded by the state. Mr. Cirino stated that he has a different perspective having been a Commissioner and he understands what Counties are going through, but realistically Local Government funding will never get back to where it was, but there is room in between that can be approved upon. Mr. Spidalieri added that Geauga County is often given the short straw in funding, which then doesn't let us handle the programs we could. Mr. Cirino talked about inside millage and the taxing authority for counties.

There will be instructions going out to get proposals together for the Capital budget, adding that he wants to help counties as much as they can.

Local residents commented on the Bill Mr. Cirino was talking about with having the Judge political affiliation on the ballot and how happy they are to see that. Mr. Cirino expressed how thankful he was that they were able to get it through.

Director Jessica Boalt expressed concern in their agency about healthcare workers and how they are going to keep seniors taken care of.

Chester Township Trustee Skip Claypool expressed that he felt there could be State action taken to make sure race-based criteria is not being used to base decisions on at NOACA.

#### <u>COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE – LETTER TO HEALTH BOARD REGARDING THOMAS</u> <u>QUADE</u>

Commissioner Spidalieri asked the Board to submit a letter to the Board of Health regarding Health Commissioner Tom Quade and that he has to support the residents on the things he has been posting on his private page and what his beliefs are being expressed are that he feels is what everyone should be doing. Mr. Spidalieri added that the mask issue is blowing up again without scientific background and he doesn't want his own personal beliefs but that our position and displeasure needs to be expressed and that he needs to be reined in or removed.

Mr. Lennon added that his phone started blowing up over the weekend with people reaching out to him about the things that were being shared by Mr. Quade and the concerns. Mr. Lennon briefly mentioned a voicemail he had received from a Doctor from the County and the interaction she had with Mr. Quade. Over the last year there have been some comments made by him and those comments undermine the Board of Health, while the Commissioners have no authority, they do have a voice. Mr. Claypool added that he too has received several calls and the concern is that his personal opinion is being translated into the advice he is giving and that is destroying trust.

Mr. Cirino added that the Health Commissioners have to report to the Health Director from the State, who has to be approved by the Senate and while he is not aware of all the nuances but if they compile a list and get it to him, he will forward to the State Health Director of the concerns.

Mr. Dvorak stated that he wanted to clarify that the Health Department is not under our hiring authority, that the political subdivisions say who has a say on the Board, not just the Townships, but the Villages and the City of Chardon. Mr. Dvorak agreed that they need to submit a letter, because all this disrupts the good work being done.

Mr. Spidalieri stated that if you want to protect what you have, you need to get involved. At the end of the day it's about family and our community, and we need to step up.

Local resident Judy Zamlen Spottz expressed that while she hasn't seen what Mr. Quade posted however, she has been contacted by many Veterans who are concerned. Ms. Boalt added that let's add that it was hard before to get an appointment at the VA and with the current concerns over vaccinations, healthcare workers are walking off the job.
