WHEREAS, the County Commissioners desire to designate the sum of Forty Million Dollars

(\$40,000,000.00) as the amount of money to be accumulated for those purposes, in accordance with R.C. 5705.13(C).

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners hereby amend Resolution No. 19-130 to designate the sum of Forty Million Dollars (\$40,000,000.00) as the amount of money to be accumulated in the capital project fund for the purposes set forth in the Resolution.

<u>PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE – APPLICATION OF PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TO EMPLOY</u> <u>BENESCH, FRIEDLANDER, COPLAN AND ARNOFF, LLP</u>

Prosecutor Jim Flaiz explained that Benesch's office is assisting the Prosecutor's office with things for the new building, adding that they are trying to do a majority of it, and then they review or a check over on the work being done. This is an application to go back to the Court for additional assistance on the other projects that will need done in the County. Mr. Morgan added that there are several projects, including with the Department on Aging community center, the Ravenwood building along with a few other projects that may need to be done. Mr. Flaiz stated that Ms. LaChapelle will prepare the documents and then Benesch will review them for final approval. There was some discussion about doing some updating and valuation of the properties from when the last study was completed. Commissioner Spidalieri thanked Mr. Flaiz for helping us get this to where we are, and that he hoped the residents of the County are grateful for what he has here, working together as a team.

KENT STATE UNIVERSITY

Commissioner Dvorak introduced Kent State Geauga Dean Angela Spalsbury, explaining that she is very involved in the Geauga County community, serving on many boards, including the University Hospitals Geauga Medical Campus Board of Directors, the Geauga Growth Partnership Board of Directors and the Geauga County Job and Family Services Advisory Board.

Ms. Blair explained that since 2018 Dr. Angela Spalsbury has served as the Dean and Chief Administrative Officer of Kent State University Geauga and Twinsburg Academic Center. Dr. Spalsbury earned her PhD in pure mathematics from Kent State. She also earned a Master of Science in mathematics from the University of Pretoria in South Africa. Before joining Kent State, she chaired the Mathematics Department at Youngstown State University. She also taught at John Carroll University, Hiram College and the University of Witwatersrand in Johannesburg, South Africa.

Dr. Angela Spalsbury expressed that she was excited to be here and at the fair. Dr. Spalsbury introduced Kent State University President Todd Diacon, explaining that President Diacon joined the Kent State University in July 2019 as the 13th President. President Diacon is a tireless advocate for student success, that he has more than 30 years of experience in higher education leadership. President Diacon has a commitment to college affordability and access has resulted in nationally recognized initiatives to boost student retention, graduation rates and academic achievement.

President Diacon joined Kent State as provost in 2012 and has been at the forefront of expanding Kent State's international presence, he has led the charge to recruit and promote more diverse faculty, and has helped the university attract world renowned leaders in the fields of aviation, engineering, brain health, liquid crystals and peace and conflict studies.

Before coming to Kent State, President Diacon served as deputy chancellor at the University of Massachusetts Amherst, where he was also a professor of history. President Diacon began his career at the University of Tennessee as a history professor.

Dr. Spalsbry stated that President Diacon is a native of Wellington, Kansas and was told he lived next to farms, while he didn't live on one. President Diacon specializes in agrarian history and the history of central state power in Brazil. He earned his bachelor's degree from Southwestern College in Kansas and his master's and doctoral degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

President Diacon is married to former Kent State employee Moema Furtado and they have one grown son. Dr. Spalsbury expressed excitement for having them here at the Great Geauga County Fair.

President Diacon stated that Wellington, Kansas and that is the county that grows more wheat than any other place in the United States, mentioning that his family was farmers and his Uncle ran a dairy farm back in the day. President Diacon stated it brought back memories being here

and thanked Dean Spalsbury for her great leadership. President Diacon stated that about five years ago they started to think about deep infrastructural impacts for our campus as a way to make a deep impact in the communities, expressing the working relationship with Superintendent Stoddard and the new school facility. It's an amazing project and a great example of how we can work together. President Diacon thanked elected officials for their hard work and thanked everyone for being their today.

Commissioner Dvorak presented President Diacon with some Geauga County Maple Syrup and posed for a few pictures.
