Mr. Lennon asked what the annual fuel cost was, to which Fiscal Officer and Chief Human Resources Officer Katie Taylor stated that last year was around \$200,000.00 but obviously with prices, it can fluctuate.

Mr. Lennon stated that so historically they have not gone out to bid, but you have to now. Mr. Coll stated that they were working on going to bid now, adding that they have always received a discount from Centerra but not on the state bid. Mr. Lennon inquired how this came about, to which Mr. Coll stated the Auditor would not pay the bill. Mr. Lennon asked about the tanks on the property to which Mr. Coll stated that they own their tanks and just pay for delivery. Water Resources went out to bid for a three-year contract. Mr. Morgan noted that the tanks at Water Resources are owned by the fuel company. There was discussion about a central fuel system or going out to bid for all fuel for multiple departments to get a better price on volume.
