## $\frac{COMMISSIONERS'\ OFFICE-RESCIND\ RESOLUTION\ \#22-020\ LEVYING\ ASSESSMENTS-CHARDON\ TOWNSHIP\ WASTEWATER\ TREATMENT\ PLANT\ AND\ SEWER\ PROJECT-FAILED\ FOR\ LACK\ OF\ 2^{ND}.$

Commissioner Dvorak explained that there was a meeting held last Wednesday for more research and review regarding the ARPA funds, made a motion to rescind Resolution #22-020 levying the assessments.

Commissioner Lennon asked about extending the time frame to allow the Prosecutor to review the use of ARPA funds. Mr. Morgan noted that we have until next week before a decision would need to be made before the time period will be up on the thirty days put into the resolution. Mr. Morgan added that if they are able to do an extension of the time period, they would need to do it by a resolution. Mr. Morgan requested to wait until next week to take any action on the resolution regarding the assessments. Mr. Lennon asked to wait until next week.

Due to a lack of a  $2^{nd}$ , the motion failed.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

Local resident Mike Valko on Howard Drive asked if the Board was going to schedule a public meeting in the future to discuss the ARPA funds.

Mr. Lennon expressed that this project is not new to anybody, including the residents, and it has been an undue hardship that was put on the residents of this community, but unfortunately the ARPA came after this project was underway. Mr. Lennon stated that it was made aware at the meeting last week that Water Resources held that ARPA could be used, however they need to review those options with legal counsel to see if the funds can or cannot be used for the project.

Marge Rus on Howard Drive asked why the Commissioners came up with a resolution to assess their homes and not using other funds. Mr. Morgan stated that the process to assess which has been discussed prior to even construction starting, is that there are rules within the ORC that must be followed, adding that this project was put in due to the failing septic systems, and that they did search out any funding that was available. Ms. Rus expressed lets fast forward and is of the feeling that there are now funds available, to which Mr. Lennon added that there might be funds. Ms. Rus asked how the time for the Prosecutor to review and public meeting tie in with the deadline ticking away on the homeowners, and who else has applied for the ARPA funds.

Mr. Dvorak noted that they have had several requests for the funds, noting the hospital has requested. Mr. Morgan added that the discussion from the meeting held on the 9<sup>th</sup> as the formal request from the residents. Mr. Lennon stated that the amount is about \$3.2 million on 113

homes and that amount of ARPA funds is \$9.1 million with another \$9 million expected sometime this year.

Chardon Township Trustee Mike Brown explained that he wanted to reiterate what the residents are saying about using the ARPA funding, reaching out to the Prosecutor's office for help. Mr. Brown expressed that he was on the conference call with the EPA and that he wanted to test all the systems and that this wasn't necessary. Mr. Lennon added that this was the EPA that mandated the project. Mr. Brown stated that the Trustees didn't ask for this, Mr. Lennon added that no one asked for this, and if you think about it there may be other areas that could have this same thing happen to them. Mr. Lennon asked the question; do we use 1/6 of the ARPA funds on 113 homes and then others become affected and ask where is our assistance. Mr. Brown inquired if the residents were going to be given six months to tie in, can there be a consideration for those with new systems that were put in. Mr. Brown stated that five people that were tied into the tile that affected to the discharge, and they were working on flooding issues with the water department and they called. Mr. Lennon and Mr. Morgan both stated that the water department did not call the EPA.

Mr. Dvorak added that he is for helping the residents. Ms. Rus expressed that the Auditor explained what would happen to their homes. Another resident added that she will never vote for another levy, she can't afford it, her and her mother live in the house together since 1961 and between their incomes they are barely making it now, and don't know how they are going to do it. This resident asked the Board if they can afford 113 homes to sit empty and let crime move in. Mr. Lennon expressed that this was coming regardless, and we just have to wait and see what we are able to do.

Auditor Chuck Walder expressed that it is a little disingenuous and to say we don't know how we can spend it. Mr. Walder mentioned the CARES Act funding and then spoke about the ARPA funds that became available and they approved a resolution to appropriate those funds, and that he has watched and read several guidelines on how the funds can be used. Mr. Walder said the funding cannot be used to repay a loan and asked when the loan was secured, was it after the \$9 million. Mr. Morgan stated that the loan was secured at least two years ago. Mr. Lennon stated that there are also Federal Procurement requirements that were not used for this project. Mr. Walder disagreed that the Board had spoken to Mr. Flaiz about this, and then expressed that these people haven't been told the truth and for at least nine years. Mr. Walder stated that these people don't know that there is an automatic increase in January of 4%, that it's posted on the website, and people have to go there to find it. Mr. Walder expressed that these people have been lied to for years. Mr. Lennon and Mr. Walder went back and forth about timing and the ARPA funds and expressed that the Board should rescind the resolution and that they were told it was on the agenda to be rescinded today. Clerk Christine Blair explained that the resolution had thirty days – the Board had a discussion previously to rescind or extend at the next meeting, and that they are waiting for a response from the Prosecutor's Office on the use of the funds and what they can do. The Board meets before the thirty-day expiration, they don't need to schedule a special meeting.

Mr. Barto asked the Board to hold an evening meeting for residents who can't attend during the day. Ms. Rus stated that we need to wait till they have all the facts, and then hold a meeting. Mr. Morgan added that he didn't feel that the evening meeting needed to happen before next week, and that during the meeting next week they would either rescind or extend the resolution.

Mr. Valko asked again about the resolution passed in February, to which it was noted February 24, 2022, Resolution #22-020. Mr. Valko asked why they waited. Mr. Morgan stated that the Board was waiting for the final rule from the US Treasury and those came in January, the Federal Procurement requirements need to be followed and this project did not do that. Mr. Walder asked how the Board researched the use of the funds. Mr. Lennon stated that there have been no decisions made, the project was already in process when the ARPA funds even came in. This project had to be bid and you have to use Federal Procurement and that is for the bid, that was done on this project.

Gale Russe from the League of Women Voters asked if the Board had a meeting on the ARPA funds. Mr. Morgan explained that the Board approved a resolution directing the Auditor to apply and accept those funds and establish funds with preliminary amounts set aside in them, capital improvements, utilities and third-party requests. Ms. Rus asked about a third party, UH Hospital, Spectrum and is that what they need to do to request those funds.
