CORSA RENEWAL

Human Resources Administrator Kathy Hostutler introduced Senior Account Executive Gary Wirtz from Insured Partners and CORSA Membership Services Manager Ali Redmond to present information on the CORSA Renewal. Mr. Wirtz explained that the County Risk Sharing Authority is the Risk Management program that handles the property, liability, automobile coverages in place. This year has been a tight year for insurances, the CORSA underwriters did a phenomenal job this year keeping all our coverages in place, including the Cyber Liability. The program overall had about a 5.7% increase, due to increased property and auto rates, public official rates, the increase for Geauga County was 2.6% and a big part of that was the Loss Control Incentive, and credits of about \$18,000.00. Ms. Hostutler added that the Directors, Agencies and employees partnering together. Mr. Wirtz stated that Geauga County is in the upper 20%. Ms. Redmond stated that this is a great advantage of pooling and what it has done for you. Mr. Wirtz noted that they had tried to do some increase to limits and were not allowed. Ms. Hostutler stated that CORSA is on top of things. Ms. Redmond stated that 66 of the 88 counties are included in the pool. Ms. Redmond expressed that with cost they couldn't increase limits. A lot of the Loss Control Incentive program is a big educational piece and to keep the awareness out there. Ms. Redmond noted that the reinsurance saw increases this year, law was a bit of an increase but property will be seeing an increase next year.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Dvorak explained that he had been in contact with David Joyce's office and spoken with Chris Cooper and because the project is an indebt project there is no extra funding available for this project.

Mr. Lennon expressed that Representative Grendell had put a budget request in but there won't be any answer until about July. Mr. Lennon inquired about any news from the Prosecutor's Office, to which Mr. Morgan stated that he had received a text from Mr. Flaiz about getting together to discuss it.

Local resident Diane Jones noted that last week there was a writ of prohibition filed on the two cases, and inquired on when the writ was going to be filed. Mr. Morgan stated he will be signed the necessary papers on Thursday and then it will be filed.

Local resident Jim Laudato expressed that David Joyce's office cannot find funding because the project is indebted. Mr. Dvorak stated that the project is indebted, money was borrowed to pay for the project. Mr. Laudato doesn't understand funding being appropriated for 2022 for the treatment plant. Mr. Laudato expressed that there's an amnesia that everyone gets, on the website that there are appropriations of \$3.1 million for 2022 and feels that it's after March 3 and ARPA. Mr. Morgan stated the project has taken several years to complete. The money for the project has been expended over the course of the project. Mr. Laudato keeps stating that it's after March 2021. Mr. Morgan stated that it's appropriated and would be a carryover.

Mr. Laudato expressed that they are hinging on Section 4.7 of the Treasury Inquiry. It does say for projects going forward, it says it hurts him to see the Engineer say that David Joyce calls them and says they have money and asked them for a project and that they are sitting there with a \$54,000.00 debt for each household. Mr. Laudato questioned Mr. Spidalieri about reading and responding to emails and phone calls. Commissioner Spidalieri stated that he hasn't been very vocal with the crowd of people every week, and he is getting frustrated that everyone is coming here thinking that the Commissioners are working against you they can't base a decision on emotion but on law. He's not the Prosecutor and can't make a legal opinion. Mr. Spidalieri doesn't want anymore of being looked at like a bad guy and be disrespected. Mr. Spidalieri stated that you feel we are against you and that is not the case. They have to wait for the Prosecutor to give us an answer, we would like to help you. Mr. Laudato asked Mr. Spidalieri to put himself in his shoes and to talk about disrespect, that the meeting is supposed to start at 9:30 a.m. and Mr. Spidalieri hasn't been here in two weeks, that he doesn't return phone calls, and to call Mr. Hitchcock, stating that he is not paying for a septic system, start the proceeding, I'm not paying. Mr. Lennon responded to Mr. Laudato in disagreeing with him, they are not sitting on their hands. Mr. Lennon stated that if ARPA won't work they are looking at other avenues, that he is working on tie ins, tank crushing, to say they are sitting on their hands, or that the Board is lying to you, Auditor Chuck Walder, is not true. This is not based on emotion, and they are waiting on a legal opinion. Mr. Laudato stated that if ARPA funds cannot be used, he will pay but it needs to be fixed going forward. Mr. Spidalieri stated that he has been listening and they need to go to the root of the problem, and how it started and the process of how we ended up here, the Commissioners didn't put you in this position, the EPA did when they were contacted, we did give push back but they ordered to project and had to get it completed. This is happening everywhere not just here, it does suck, because they don't care who you are. The Board is doing what we can to help you, but it has to be legal, ethical and allowable. Mr. Laudato keeps bringing up the funding in the budget, to which Mr. Spidalieri stated that there are 95,000 residents and it has to be fair and equitable for everyone. There was discussion about the Board not using General Fund money as it is not fair for other taxpayers to pay for their project. Mr. Spidalieri mentioned the Thompson project and this project, that there could be more coming, that they appreciate them coming out, but they have to wait for the legal opinion. Mr. Laudato kept adding that he isn't on the agenda so he has to come back, he knows they agree, but he wants to the Board to do, that he wants to have a voice, be respected, heard like everyone else.

Resident Chuck DiCillo expressed that he did his homework, during the court case, that he knew who hit the pipe, and that the Health Department made the call to the EPA. Mr. Morgan stated that when the pipe was hit, they called the Water Resources department to check the water, the Trustees and the Health Department were notified, but that the Trustees sent the letter to the EPA. The EPA set the precedent and the project and issued the orders.
