Resolution for Stepping Up to Reduce the Number of People with Mental Illnesses and Co-occurring Substance Use Disorders in Jails

WHEREAS, counties routinely provide treatment services to the estimated 2 million people with serious mental illnesses booked into jail each year;

WHEREAS, almost three-quarters of adults with serious mental illnesses in jails have co- occurring substance use disorders;

WHEREAS, county jails spend significantly more on adults who require interventions compared to those without these treatment needs;

WHEREAS, without the appropriate treatment and services, people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders continue to cycle through the criminal justice system, often resulting in tragic outcomes for these individuals and their families;

WHEREAS, Geauga County and all counties take pride in their responsibility to protect and enhance the health, welfare, and safety of its residents in efficient and cost-effective ways;

WHEREAS, Geauga County has a treatment program at our Geauga County Safety Center with the Lake Geauga Recovery Services Center and assisted the Common Pleas Court in implementing the Geauga County New Leaf Drug Court Program;

WHEREAS, through <u>Stepping Up</u>, the National Association of Counties, The Council of State Governments Justice Center, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation are encouraging public, private, and nonprofit partners to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jails.

WHEREAS, through Stepping Up efforts in Ohio, technical assistance and resource opportunities may be available to communities that wish to establish or expand local

collaboration and capacity as it relates to individuals with mental illness and substance use disorders who are justice involved; and

NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED, THAT the Geauga County Board of Commissioners do hereby sign on to the Call to Action to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders in our county jail, commit to sharing lessons learned with other counties in my state and across the country to support a national initiative and encourage all county officials, employees, and residents to participate in Stepping Up. We resolve to utilize the comprehensive resources available through Stepping Up to:

- Convene or draw on a diverse team of leaders and decision makers from multiple agencies committed to examine options for improvement;
- Collect and review prevalence numbers and assess individuals' needs to better identify adults entering jails with behavioral health conditions and their recidivism risk, and use that baseline information to guide decision making at the system, program, and case levels;
- Examine treatment and service capacity to determine which programs and services are available in the county for people with mental illnesses and co-occurring substance use disorders, and identify state and local policy and funding barriers to minimizing contact with the justice system and providing treatment and supports in the community;
 - Develop a plan with measurable outcomes that draws on the jail assessment and prevalence data and the examination of available treatment and service capacity, while considering identified barriers;
 - Implement research-based approaches that advance the plan; and
 - Create a process to track progress using data and information systems, and to report on successes

RESOLUTION APPROVING AMERICAN RESCUE PLAN ACT OF 2021 EXPENDITURE

WHEREAS, The President of the United States signed into law the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARPA) on March 11, 2021; and

WHEREAS, ARPA provides money to States, Counties and Municipalities to address the continuing impact of COVID-19 on the economy, public health, state and local governments, individuals and businesses; and

WHEREAS, the County has received a distribution of monies from the ARPA; and

WHEREAS, Title VI section 603(c)(1)(D) of the Federal Register provides for ARPA funds to make necessary investments in water, sewer or broadband infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners through the Department of Water Resources has constructed a public sanitary sewer and wastewater treatment plant in Chardon Township; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to have the property owners connect to the sewer system in a timely manner to eliminate the public health emergency of failing septic systems within the Berkshire Heights subdivision;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners approves the use of ARPA funds to provide grants to the property owners within the Berkshire Heights subdivision up to \$8,000.00 per service connection (maximum \$904,000.00 for 113 houses).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners approves the use of ARPA funds to reimburse the Department of Water Resources \$350.00 per service connection to allow the Department to waive the permit application and inspection fee normally charged by the department for service connections.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners orders the Department of Water Resources to establish a program for providing the grants to the property owners with a termination date on which connections after that date will not be covered and a method for tracking installations and payment from the grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon submittal of contractor invoices by Water Resources, the Board of County Commissioners instructs the County Auditor to pay the contractors hired by the property owners the cost of connection installation and associated costs up to \$8,000.00 in accordance with the established procedure by Water Resources from the ARPA fund.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners instructs the County Auditor to transfer \$39,550.00 to the Water Resources Federal Grants Account (#5002-030-00-412) as reimbursement for 113 service connection permit and inspection fees.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution becomes part of the permanent record of the Board of Commissioners of Geauga County, Ohio.
