## <u>TRANSIT – DISCUSSION – FEASIBILITY STUDY COMPLETED BY RLS AND ASSOCIATES</u> <u>ON BEHALF OF THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION</u>

Director JoAnna Santilli explained that ODOT hired RLS and Associates to do a Feasibility Study to do a review of the Transit Department. Ms. Santilli explained part of the study included looking at continuing how we are operating but with not having local funding matches they can't increase our funding, so they also looked at contracting with other agencies, to which Ms. Santilli added that they already do shared services with LakeTran. Ms. Santilli noted that an option that was proposed was to contract with LakeTran to be part of them but still branded as Transit, and if it didn't work they can still remain as Geauga Transit. Ms. Santilli explained that a big portion affects the number and kinds of buses that they can get but allows them to offer different types of runs for people going back and forth to work, not stopping wheelchair service but could end up being a savings. Ms. Santilli stated that LakeTran does Medicaid billing, which would allow us to work more with MRDD, which would give us additional revenue coming in. Ms. Santilli explained that parts and fuel would be better pricing. Ms. Santilli stated that no staff would be let go, benefits and OPERS, they would become employees of LakeTran.

Commissioner Lennon asked how it would work, would they become part of Lake County, to which Ms. Santilli stated that we would be contracted under LakeTran but the MOU would still allow an out for both agencies and still stay Geauga Transit. Mr. Lennon understands what the idea is but still wants to remain separate and have an identity. Ms. Santilli stated that the grant to ODOT would be joint and the urban and rural funding has to remain separate but gives the opportunity for larger funding from ODOT. Ms. Santilli explained that her end goal is to get as many Geauga County residents to as many places as they can go. Mr. Lennon inquired about dipping the toe instead of five years, to which Ms. Santilli expressed that you need to do multiple years because she doesn't feel you will see any results in the first year. Commissioner Spidalieri added that it would be tough to move all the employees over for only one year. Ms. Santilli agreed. Mr. Lennon stated that he had sat in on the meetings with ODOT, but feels he would to get input and feedback from employees. Ms. Santilli stated there would no routes, it would still be on demand, it's getting more drivers out in smaller vehicles to get more buses on the road. Things will still be here, but as employees retire things could change but the facility and buses will be here. Ms. Santilli stated that our mechanic is here and will still be here and buses would be maintained here, with the ability to get parts and do larger repairs if needed. In essence we would still be Geauga Transit, here but we become part of LakeTran but will have the crossover into the other county. Mr. Lennon asked if there were any other counties in the state that have merged like this. LakeTran CEO Ben Capelle explained that Zanesville has eleven rural transit systems that have consolidated and merged but no rural and urban forming a partnership like we

are looking at doing. Mr. Capelle expressed that they spent a lot of time talking to RLS and what they put together and agree that it makes sense in a lot of ways and there is a benefit for LakeTran as well, and when you increase numbers you get better pricing and will benefit both of us. Mr. Capelle stated that when you work together it will allow us to get better points for grant funding and will allow us to draw down more funds for both. Mr. Capelle added that having the ability to take clients into Geauga or Lake for doctor appointments can expand the rider base. Mr. Capelle stated that there will be 2 bank accounts and they would not touch unless Transit pays LakeTran to do something, or a joint grant application for buses, but it will still have a clear path for the funding. Mr. Lennon asked if they were truly merging, to which Mr. Capelle stated that LakeTran would run Geauga Transit under a contract and if it doesn't work it can be separated. Mr. Capelle added that ODOT has offered funding to help with up front costs to assist with bringing the two together with software, servers, computers and phones. Mr. Spidalieri applauded them for looking at this, not having the mentality of but we have always done it this way. Mr. Spidalieri thanked Lake County for their assistance. Mr. Lennon and Mr. Dvorak asked what the next step would be. Ms. Santilli stated that RLS put together a generic MOU to send to legal on both sides and begin the process of putting things together, but we wanted to hear what your thoughts are first. Mr. Capelle stated that they share the same concerns as the Commissioners regarding branding and separation and giving the right message. Mr. Capelle stated that LakeTran has two levies, a continuous and one that is every ten years for budgeting, their annual budget is about \$22 million versus Transit that has \$2.6 million. Mr. Capelle stated that staff and buses would remain here, the only slight change could be some administrative functions. Ms. Santilli stated that the employees would become LakeTran, with benefits and OPERS. Mr. Capelle stated that drivers are Union but the Transit employees would be given an option to be union or not. Ms. Santilli stated that she will move forward with working on an MOU with legal. The timeline they are looking at would give them the ability to do a joint grant together and not have to wait another year to apply. Mr. Capelle noted that ODOT has asked for any transition to begin on the State Fiscal year which starts July

WHEREAS, the County's McFarland Wastewater Treatment Plant was constructed in 1976 as an extended aeration treatment system; and

WHEREAS, the County's McFarland Wastewater Treatment Plant was upgraded in 2005 to a membrane style wastewater treatment plant; and

WHEREAS, the County's McFarland Wastewater Treatment Plant at 1.8 MGD is the County's largest wastewater treatment plant services numerous properties in Bainbridge Township, Auburn Township, South Russell Village and Russell Township; and

WHEREAS, the County's McFarland Wastewater Treatment Plant is under a consent decree with the National EPA (USEPA); and

WHEREAS, the County's McFarland Wastewater Treatment Plant is in need of replacement and upgrades to remove the membrane style treatment system to achieve the required compliance with the USEPA consent decree; and

WHEREAS, all upgrades or changes to wastewater treatment plants require submission to and approval from the Ohio EPA through a Permit to Install (PTI) application and a revision to the NPDES Permit; and
