Mr. Spidalieri asked Mr. Walder, present in the meeting about the use of ARPA funds, to which Mr. Walder explained that the State Auditor stated that you cannot move money out of the ARPA funds to any other fund unless you have approval from the Tax Commissioner. Mr. Walder stated that a Township was dinged on their audit, however you can make multiple line item account and pay out of the ARPA funds as long as its an approved ARPA use. Mr. Walder stated that there is no allowance to transfer ARPA funds unless you have permission of the Tax Commissioner. Mr. Morgan stated that we could not transfer the funds to the airport, however we are still trying to figure out if it is an allowable use of funds, and learned that there have been changes again on the use. Mr. Spidalieri asked Ric Blamer what the Airport was in need from the Commissioners. Mr. Blamer stated that they were waiting for permission from the Commissioners to move forward and since its not a typical project there should be a discussion on funding. Mr. Gorton stated that he wanted to interject and state that a majority of the funds has already been transferred to the Airport Construction fund. Mr. Gorton stated that they just need about \$40 - \$50,000.00 more to complete the project.

additional funds needed to the airport construction fund.
