OHIO GUIDESTONE

Ohio Guidestone Regional Program Manager Kimberly Brown for both Lake and Geauga Counties. In Geauga County they provide 4 programs, three programs are funded by Job and Family Services and one by Developmental Disabilities. Ms. Brown has been with Guidestone for nine years here in Geauga. Ms. Brown stated that the program has been Berea Children's Home and Family Services and been in existence since the civil war, now they have over forty programs in Berea and Cuyahoga County and include programs for depression and psychiatric care to our current workforce 360 program that works on the individual 360 degrees, which includes other factors aside from employment. Ms. Brown and her associate presented the following information to the Board on the four programs offered in Geauga County.



The first program is the Comprehensive Case Management and Employment Program (CCMEP) for individuals ages 14 to 24 and help them work on themselves in order to be self-sufficient. Ms. Brown explained that in 2014 Governor Kasich had a team find out why middle-aged adults were still on assistance, and it was discovered that they never learned the skills needed to be self-sufficient.

CCMEP

CCMEP is an innovative program that can help lowincome young adults build career paths, find employment and break the cycle of poverty. It offers a wide range of services specifically tailored to each individual

Other methods used are an Individualized Opportunity Plan (IOP) which are short term goals that build towards a long-term goal, including a month, six months to a year as a long term, assisting with school programs to avoid dropouts, assistance with grades, signing up for school, tutors, job clubs and career prep. Another option is a Goal Forward Method, which focuses on strengths of the individual.

Ms. Brown added that a goal in the program could be getting their drivers license, what are the steps to obtain that, get the book, reading it, and taking the classes and then taking the test and getting that license, as transportation is an issue in Geauga county.

Mr. Dvorak asked how many youths they help during the summer, to which Ms. Brown said the highest was 55, during COVID it dropped and on average is about 35. There was a brief discussion about taking donations, including furniture that will help the program participants in moving out on their own. Commissioner Spidalieri asked about where the funding comes from, to which Ms. Brown stated the majority of funding comes from Job and Family Services, including TANF funding for individuals aged 14 – 18 or 19 to 24 with a minor in the household. Mr. Spidalieri asked for the total budget which it was noted is \$565,000.00 and goes towards the programs and services they provide. There are about 25 SSA's in the county that work with individuals that offer those with disabilities the ability to choose who they want to work with. Mr. Spidalieri stated that it's often hard to swallow that we failed to teach the skills needed, when you see help wanted signs, to which Ms. Brown stated that the program is not just the work portion, these individuals have barriers, troubled pasts, that include homelessness, foster care aging out, traumatic pasts, including sexual abuse and mental health issues. Ohio Guidestone runs with a program called bridges out of poverty and the steps to get out of it.
