COMMISSIONERS OFFICE - COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

MENTAL HEALTH AND RECOVERY SERVICES – ACKNOWLEDGE RECEIPT – CERTIFICATE OF ESTIMATED PROPERTY TAX REVENUE – MENTAL HEALTH .7 MILL RENEWAL

Director Christine Lakomiak explained that the estimated property tax revenue certificate has been received from the Auditor's Office and shows about \$19.00 for each \$100,000.00 for a period of five years. This levy was first passed in 1989 and replaced 2009 and can be used for both mental health and substance abuse disorder treatments. Ms. Lakomiak provided direct resources to the Board for the services this levy provides. Commissioner Spidalieri asked if there was any possibility to use the Mental Health Offices for potential use of space for the Lake Geauga Recovery Services. Ms. Lakomiak explained that she did speak with Ms. Blasko and that

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idea of being centrally located wasn't a bad idea however it's the amount of space needed that is of concern. Ms. Lakomiak stated that there is room for discussion. Mr. Spidalieri added that they asked for a one-time funding request, however he feels that more will be needed, but given the topic, it could be something to consider expanding on. Ms. Lakomiak answered a question from Mr. Dvorak about the ability for agencies to seek funding from multiple sources.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING IT NECESSARY TO LEVY A TAX IN EXCESS OF THE TEN MILL LIMITATION AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE NECESSARY REQUIREMENTS OF THE COUNTY'S COMMUNITY ALCOHOL, DRUG ADDICTION AND MENTAL HEALTH SERVICE DISTRICT AT THE REQUEST OF THE GEAUGA COUNTY BOARD OF MENTAL HEALTH AND RECOVERY SERVICES, O.R.C. 5705.221 and .25

The Board of County Commissioners of the County of Geauga, State of Ohio, met in regular session on the 11th day of July, 2023, commencing at 9:30 o'clock a.m. at the Commissioners' Meeting Room, 12611 Ravenwood Drive, Room B303, Chardon, Ohio, 44024, with the following members present:

Ralph Spidalieri James W. Dvorak Timothy C. Lennon

The Clerk advised the Board of County Commissioners that the notice requirements of R.C. 121.22 and the implementing rules adopted by the Board thereto were complied with for the meeting.

Commissioner Lennon moved for the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the amount of taxes which may be raised within the ten mill limitation will be insufficient to provide an adequate amount for the necessary requirements of the Geauga County

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Board of Mental Health and Recovery Services f.k.a. Geauga Community Board of Mental Health, Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services established pursuant to Chapter 340 of the Ohio Revised Code.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Geauga, State of Ohio, two-thirds of all members elected thereto concurring, that:

Section 1. It is necessary to levy a tax in excess of the ten mill limitation for the benefit of the Geauga County Board of Mental Health and Recovery Services for the purpose of providing the Geauga County Board of Mental Health and Recovery Services with sufficient funds for the operation of mental health programs at a rate not exceeding seven tenths (.70) of one mill for each one dollar (\$1.00) of valuation, which amounts to nineteen dollars and no cents (\$19.00) for each one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) of valuation, for a period of five (5) years and which levy is a renewal of an existing levy of seven tenths (.70) of one mill. The tax shall be levied in tax year 2024 and begin collection in year 2025. The subdivision has territory affected in Geauga County.

Section 2. The question of levying additional taxes shall be submitted to the electors of said Geauga County and if passed the tax shall be levied upon the territory of Geauga County at the general election to be held at the usual voting place of Geauga County on November 7, 2023.

Section 3. Said levy shall be placed upon the tax list of the tax year 2023 if a majority of the electors voting thereon vote in favor thereof.

Section 4. The Board of Elections is hereby directed to submit the question of levying the tax pursuant to this resolution and Ohio Revised Code Sections 5705.221 and .25 to the electors of Geauga County at the general election to be held on November 7, 2023.

Section 5. The Clerk of the Board of Commissioners of Geauga County is directed to deliver a certified copy of this resolution to the Board of Elections not less than ninety (90) days before the general election to be held on November 7, 2023 and notify said Board of Elections to cause notice of elections on the question of levying said tax to be given as required by law.

Section 6. This Board finds and determines that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to the adoption of this resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Board and that all deliberations of this Board and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law, including O.R.C. 121.22.
