#### **DISCUSSION**

Mr. Morgan briefly a request of the Prosecutor of an Attorney General's opinion on the Health Department, a recent article in the paper states that the Prosecutor wasn't going to only submit their opinion and not one from the Attorney General. Mr. Dvorak expressed that if you zone in on Chardon becoming a city in 2001, there are probably other locations that became a city and don't have their own health department, the question needs to be answered if they are required to have their own. The Board of Commissioners asked for an AG opinion, but the Board chose to wait to see what the response is from the Prosecutor and go from there.

Mr. Dvorak expressed that the expansion of the Courthouse as a schedule and the Probation Department and Law Library needs to be moved from the basement of the Courthouse and asked the Board to have Ms. Burhenne look into moving them into the third floor of the Opera House, we have worked hard on buildings and leases but haven't gotten anywhere. Mr. Spidalieri asked what the holdup was, the agreement has been being worked on since November and why we aren't getting this back, even on the lease. Mr. Lennon brought up reaching out to the Judges and see where we are on this. Mr. Spidalieri asked for an update on the lease. Ms. Burhenne stated that we started working on the lease in the beginning of December, it took a while to get a draft to the sellers, we got it sent to them last week and they were taken back on the changes that were requested. We then took the lease to our outside counsel that has a real estate attorney in the office and rewrote the lease that still protects the county but not as ominous to the sellers, and we hope to be able to put something before you by the 30<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Spidalieri stated that we are putting a lot of time and effort into a lease that if we can get the purchase agreement done we would be the key holder and it has become a huge deal over something that is a holdover, we need to get some answers, adding that Mr. Dvorak was to reach out to the Prosecutor and they haven't been able to connect. Mr. Dvorak stated that on the construction side we are on a time frame and want to keep the scheduling going if we can. Mr. Spidalieri expressed concern on moving people around over and over, putting IT in place and then having to move it for a temporary fix. Mr. Lennon asked if there was some issue with the Board trying to buy the Chase Building, along with the amount of money spent on outside counsel to get things done. Mr. Spidalieri stated that they need to things right, and we shouldn't put a band aid on something that is a direction they don't want to go. Mr. Dvorak continued by saying that a letter was received by the owners of the Chase Building about another obstacle that is taking longer than anticipated, due to some damage that they were not aware of. Ms. Burhenne stated that a room had some water damage that was going to be prepared and they opened it up and found more

damage that needed to be repaired and would push back the time for the lease to start. Mr. Spidalieri asked for discussion about the options and see where we sit, and if the project gets moved back it happens, but we need to be responsible with the taxpayers' money. Mr. Lennon agreed that we need to get the lease finished if we can, and where are we on getting them out of the Courthouse, which was Feb. 1<sup>st</sup> but has a little wiggle room to about Feb. 6<sup>th</sup>. Mr. Dvorak stated that we need to get the lease done and move the departments to keep the courthouse moving forward and on schedule.
